Report of 10 sponsored children (Fr. Placido Fund) 2025- 2026

The Good Shepherd Sisters continue their dedicated mission in the Roman Catholic Diocese of Bongaigaon, serving especially the poor and marginalized families in Assam. Two Sisters are presently teaching at Don Bosco English Medium School, Bahari, which is administered by the diocesan. The school is a vibrant community made up of children from four different backgrounds — Assamese, Bengali, Muslim, and Boro Tribe. This diversity fosters harmony, mutual respect, and unity among the students.

During the academic year 2025–2026, ten students from economically disadvantaged families were supported with financial assistance to cover their tuition fees. These students are studying in various classes, ranging from the primary to the higher sections. Among them, three students are raised by single mothers who shoulder the entire responsibility of earning and caring for their families. Without this assistance, it would have been extremely difficult for them to continue their children's education. A total amount of Rs. 93,390.00 (Rupees Ninety-Three Thousand Three Hundred Ninety only) was received for the academic year 2025–2026 and was fully utilized toward the monthly tuition fees of these ten students. This timely support relieved the families from financial stress and ensured that the students could attend school regularly without interruption.



Beyond financial help, the Sisters extend personal attention to each child. They motivate them to study diligently, build self-confidence, and develop good values. The Sisters also visit the families, understand their situations, and offer moral and spiritual support. As a result, the students are gradually improving in their academic performance, participation, and overall development.



The students and their parents deeply appreciate this generous assistance, as it gives them hope for a better future through education.

Heartfelt gratitude is extended to Sr. Pushpa Louis, Province Leader of CEIN, and her team for creating this opportunity for the ten children to continue their

studies. Special thanks are also offered to Fr. Placido for his generous financial contribution toward the education of these children. May God bless him abundantly and reward him for his kindness and concern for the underprivileged.
